

## **ESTABLISHING THE ALCOHOL IMPACT AREA: A CHRONOLOGY OF EVENTS**

**Community Liaison Officer Greg Hopkins helped organize a collaboration that turned state level policy change into tangible community progress.**

- **Officer Hopkins begins outreach to stakeholders in his assigned areas, informing them of the Police Department's commitment to neighborhood improvement**
- **Hopkins and community leaders partner to establish possible boundaries and no-sale list encourage alcohol vendors to sign Good Neighbor Agreements**
- **Hopkins establishes Drug House Elimination Task Force**
- **After six months, voluntary restrictions is deemed ineffective as products are still widely available**
- **Hopkins joins statewide task force to identify solutions for public inebriation**
- **250 community members successfully advocate to City Council for neighborhood AIA designation**
- **State Liquor Control Board grants municipalities authority to restrict local alcohol sales**
- **3rd Party study by Washington State University finds significant beneficial impact 2 years after establishing the AIA**
